Changhua Branch Promotes Legal Awareness through Board Game Fun with Tung-Der Students

To instill the concepts of legal compliance and integrity, Changhua Branch of the Administrative Enforcement Agency, Ministry of Justice (hereinafter the “Changhua Branch”), led by Director-General Ching-Ming Kuo, visited Private Tung-Der High School (hereinafter “Tung-Der High School”) on May 14, 2024, to conduct the “Hand in Hand with Youths for Integrity” legal education campaign. This event featured a skit titled “On-site Enforcement over Drunk Driving Obligators” and students experience of “Ace Enforcer” board game, offering a fresh and engaging approach to legal education. This innovative method incorporating education in entertainment was well-received by both teachers and students.

Principal Chih-Sung Tsai of the Tung-Der High School remarked that the decreasing birthrate has made school

management increasingly challenging. The Changhua Branch's legal education promotion not only provided students with correct concepts and attitudes but also demonstrated to parents the school's dedication to integrating diverse resources into education. Before the event, Principal Tsai presented a certificate of appreciation to the Changhua Branch, acknowledging their effort and commitment to cultivating law-abiding citizens starting from the school level.

During the event, Changhua Branch staff performed a light-hearted skit depicting the process of seizing movable property, interacting directly with 16 Tung-Der students. This face-to-face engagement helped students understand the significance of the “last mile” of administrative enforcement in achieving social justice. The event also included a board game popular amongst students, where students competed in groups, taking on the role of administrative enforcement officers and experiencing various enforcement scenarios. With different strategies and skills, they may effectively carry out their duties in the game. Despite the game's close resemblance to real-life enforcement challenges, the students quickly grasped its essence and became “Ace Enforcers”, comprehending the core value of “enforcement with love, justice without hindrance”.

Moving forward, the Changhua Branch will continue to uphold the spirit of justice and care, tradition and innovation. In addition to utilizing legally mandated enforcement measures and improving enforcement efficiency, they will frequently engage with schools. These efforts aim to educate students about the
