**Minister of Justice Returns to Alma Mater to Witness
Internship Agreement Signing**

**Administrative Enforcement Agency and National Chung
Hsing University formalize internships; Changhua Branch
and School of Law sign an MOU to bridge legal education and
practice**

On the morning of the 26th, Minister of Justice Cheng, Ming-Chien returned to his alma mater, National Chung Hsing University (NCHU), in his capacity as a distinguished alumnus and senior of the Department of Law to witness the signing of an off-campus internship agreement between NCHU and the Administrative Enforcement Agency (AEA), Ministry of Justice. The agreement was signed by AEA Director-General Miao, Jhuo-Ran and NCHU President Fuh-Jyh Jan. In addition, the School of Law and the AEA Changhua Branch executed a memorandum of understanding (MOU), signed by Dean Hsing-An Chen and Changhua Branch Director Kuo Ching-Ming.

In his remarks, Minister Cheng encouraged NCHU students to use the AEA's internship program to translate foundational legal theory into practice and to gain a clearer understanding of public administration. He expressed the hope that closer cooperation between his alma mater and public agencies would deepen institutional mechanisms for collaboration.

Director-General Miao thanked NCHU for joining the internship partnership and commended the Changhua Branch for its strong performance in judicial-auction outreach and in supporting vulnerable groups. He encouraged the students present to leverage this opportunity to learn the substance of administrative enforcement and experience day-to-day practice, which in turn will aid them in their future career planning. He added that the signing would further strengthen ties and knowledge exchange between practitioners and academia in the administrative-enforcement field.

NCHU's Nantou Campus, located in Zhongxing New Village, hosts the School of Law as a resident teaching unit and lies within the jurisdiction of the AEA's Changhua Branch—a setting that helped make this collaboration possible thanks to the efforts of Director Kuo Ching-Ming. The Changhua Branch announced that during the summer it will offer 14 internship placements for NCHU law students. The 36-hour practicum will be led by experienced enforcement officers and will allow students to observe how administrative enforcement carries justice through its “last mile,” including participation in judicial-auction procedures, thereby realizing the goal of integrating legal education with hands-on training.

Dignitaries in attendance included NCHU Vice President Mu-Kuan Chen; Yuh-May Lin, Dean of the College of Law and Politics; Chin-Chun Lin, Chief Prosecutor of the Taichung Branch, Taiwan High Prosecutors Office; Chieh-Chin Chang, Chief Prosecutor of the Taichung District Prosecutors Office; Yu-Ping Chen, Director of the MOJ Office of the Minister; along with many NCHU faculty and students. Together they witnessed this milestone in university–government cooperation at a ceremony that was simple yet dignified.
