**Changhua Branch Auctions “Salty Youtiao” Trademark; Zi  
Nan Temple Chair Presents Year-of-the-Snake Lucky Coins  
to Winning Bidders**

**“Guashan Judicial Auction Marketplace” Features  
Concurrent Anti-Bribery and Anti-Fraud Outreach by  
Nantou District Prosecutors Office**

The Ministry of Justice Administrative Enforcement Agency, Changhua Branch, held the “Guashan Judicial Auction Marketplace” yesterday (April 1) at the Sheliao Community Activity Center next to Jhushan Zi Nan Temple in Nantou. The most inquired-about item—the “Salty Youtiao” trademark rights—sold in the first round of bidding for NT\$96,000 above the reserve price. Three automobiles and one lot of a biotechnology company’s stock were also sold. Zi Nan Temple Chairperson Chuang visited the venue and presented Year-of-the-Snake “lucky coins” to each successful bidder for movable property. In the bazaar area, items such as tea leaves, umbrellas, and stools sold out quickly. In total, over NT\$520,000 was credited to the national treasury; proceeds will be applied to settle delinquent taxes and fines owed by obligors.

With the four-day Tomb-Sweeping holiday approaching, Zi Nan Temple drew continuous crowds. Capitalizing on the turnout, the Changhua Branch conducted an anti-fraud quiz with prizes. Chief Prosecutor Kuo of the Nantou District Prosecutors Office led the Probation Office and trainee judicial officers to the site to deliver anti-vote-buying and anti-fraud outreach. The Changhua District Court, the Nantou District Court, and the Central Region Maintenance Engineering Branch of the Directorate General of Highways also sent personnel to observe. Despite the damp, chilly weather, the auction and public-education activities proceeded in a lively atmosphere with strong participation from all sides.

Changhua Branch Director Kuo Ching-Ming expressed gratitude for Zi Nan Temple's robust support, which helped convert the pilgrim traffic into bidding momentum and facilitated the monetization of obligors' assets—reducing their debt burdens while safeguarding the state's claims. He added that participants also gained legal-literacy on judicial auctions and anti-fraud measures, making the event a triple win.

The next judicial auction hosted by the Changhua Branch will be held on May 6.
