**Joint Inauguration of New Premises for the Changhua
Branch and the Changhua District Prosecutors Office
International Medal-Winning Choir Offers Blessings as the
Changhua Judicial Park Is Born**

The Ministry of Justice Administrative Enforcement Agency (AEA) Changhua Branch and the Changhua District Prosecutors Office held a joint inauguration ceremony for their new premises at 10:00 a.m. today (August 1). Minister of Justice Cheng Ming-Chien, Changhua County Magistrate Wang Hui-Mei, Prosecutor-General of the Supreme Prosecutors Office Hsing Tai-Chao, AEA Director-General Miao Jhuo-Ran, Changhua Branch Director Kuo Ching-Ming, Chief Prosecutor of the Changhua District Prosecutors Office Hsieh Ming-Guan, and President of the Changhua District Court Chen Yu-Hsiu joined other court and prosecutorial leaders to cut the ribbon, celebrating last month's relocation of both agencies to their new building on Section 2, Yuanlin Avenue.

The ceremony was warm and lively. Hosts Director Kuo and Chief Prosecutor Hsieh opened with welcome remarks, followed by an auspicious lion-dance performance. Fresh from winning a Silver

Award at the Tokyo International Choir Competition, the Pinghe Elementary School Choir from Changhua City offered musical blessings. Minister Cheng, Prosecutor-General Hsing, and Magistrate Wang delivered congratulatory remarks. Minister Cheng thanked predecessors and partners for their support in bringing the project to completion, and expressed appreciation for former Deputy Minister Chen Ming-Tang and Magistrate Wang for their efforts in creating an excellent environment within the emerging Judicial Park. He encouraged colleagues at the Changhua Branch and the District Prosecutors Office to practice humane, service-oriented justice that advances the public good in their renewed workplace.

During the event, the Changhua Branch screened a self-produced video chronicling the 25-year journey of the Branch, which had long rented private office space in Changhua City at an annual cost of several million New Taiwan dollars. Despite that, colleagues diligently enforced 12.6 million cases across Changhua and Nantou Counties, raising NT\$27.7 billion for the national treasury. In alignment with MOJ policy, the project site was shifted from Changhua City to Yuanlin City. The new building stands on the former site of the A.Mart Yuanlin store; the film showed the vacant lot after demolition, time-lapse footage of construction from the ground up, and aerial views of the completed exterior—tenderly portraying the Branch’s “journey” from the foot of Bagua Mountain in Changhua City to the foot of Baiguo Mountain in Yuanlin.

After the ceremony, Minister Cheng, accompanied by Director-General Miao, led guests on a tour of the new premises. The Branch’s mascot “Pai-Bao” greeted visitors for commemorative

photos. Director Kuo guided the group through the Public Service Center, auction rooms, and office areas. The Minister offered words of encouragement, expressing hope for even stronger performance in the Branch's new "home."

The new building is the nation's first co-located facility shared by a District Prosecutors Office and an AEA enforcement branch, which—together with the District Court—forms the Changhua Judicial Park. Its architecture integrates the natural landscape of the Babao Irrigation Canal and green-building concepts. Bright, spacious, and well-ventilated interiors will substantially enhance public service quality and improve the work environment for staff. The building also features ample parking for cars and motorcycles, reducing the time the public spends searching for spaces when handling affairs on site.

Today's ceremony, graced by many dignitaries, concluded successfully at 11:15 a.m. With the opening of the new premises, the Changhua Branch will continue to safeguard justice, deepen people-centered services, and contribute new energy to the Changhua Judicial Park—living out the core spirit engraved in the lobby: "Uphold Justice; Enforce with Compassion for the Common Good."
