**Changhua Branch Gives Back During Relocation
Passing on Gratitude by Donating Pre-Owned Office
Equipment to Start a Cycle of Goodwill**

After renting offices in Changhua City for 25 years, the Ministry of Justice Administrative Enforcement Agency, Changhua Branch formally relocated to its new premises in Yuanlin in July 2025, marking a new chapter of service to the local community. To use funds prudently, the Branch outfitted part of the new building with newly purchased furniture suited to the space while continuing to use serviceable items from the former site. Some furnishings—office desks, chairs, and filing cabinets that had been in use for 25 years—were too worn to move. Rather than discard them, the Branch chose to donate usable pieces and give them a second life.

With coordination by the Nantou County Association for the Promotion of Service and Altruism, the Branch donated 82 desks and chairs and 239 cabinets to 25 agencies, organizations, and schools across Changhua and Nantou Counties, including the Huashan Social Welfare Foundation — Tianwei Station, the

Huatan Emergency Relief Association, and the Fangyuan Township Office, among others. Association Chair Yeh Tsai-Ping presented a certificate of appreciation to Branch Director Kuo Ching-Ming, commending the Branch for “starting a cycle of goodwill and embodying selfless altruism.”

Director Kuo also led colleagues to attend a donation ceremony at the Fangyuan Township Office Cleaning Team, where Township Mayor Lin Pao-ling accepted 34 steel lockers on the team’s behalf. The Mayor noted that the team had long lacked lockers, leaving personal belongings to be placed wherever space could be found. The donated lockers solved the problem, bringing order and a fresh look to the workspace. In a charming touch, team members repainted the lockers and hand-painted anime characters, making the 25-year-old units look like new and showcasing creative reuse. Director Kuo expressed strong appreciation and said he hopes this donation will convey the Branch’s gratitude on the occasion of a smooth relocation and extend the power of kindness to all recipient units.

This resource-conservation donation initiative is more than repurposing old items—it reflects the public sector’s commitment to environmental sustainability, social responsibility, and community care. As it moved into the new building, the Branch converted retired assets into tangible contributions to society, effectively practicing resource recycling and avoiding waste. The donations not only improved hardware conditions for the recipients but also spread goodwill, allowing the furniture to keep creating value in new settings. Looking ahead, in its new home the

Changhua Branch will continue to uphold a people-centered mission, leveraging a better work environment and proactive actions to carry forward the spirit of care and compassion together with partners across society.
